PROGRAM NEWS

Canadian artist Christi Belcourt's paintings are, in her own words, "about the interconnectedness of all living things to the spirit and power of Mother Earth, the medicines of the plant world and the life the waters hold on this earth for us all. We are indebted to all living things that sustain life on earth."

Renowned for her painting technique inspired by the beadwork of Metis and First Nation women, her large acrylic works can contain over 20,000 meticulously placed dots. The subject matter of her beautiful work is primarily floral patterns and insects, birds and other animals, water, and the cycle of nature and life.

Ms. Belcourt comes from the Metis community. The French word metis, spelled with a lower case m and pronounced may-TEE, is a racial designation meaning individuals or people with mixed-race ancestries, usually North American indigenous and European. The second meaning of being Metis refers to people with a distinct history in the specific region of Canada's western prairies. This is self-designated and embraced by the Metis Nation. Her father, Tony Belcourt, was an Indigenous rights leader who, in 1970, was elected as the founding president of the Native Council of Canada. Her sister Suzanne is a graphic designer and artist, and her brother Shane is a writer/director/musician/ cinematographer known for a feature film depicting the life of First Nations people.

With this family background, it would seem unsurprising that Christi would become an activist, artist and environmentalist, but it took her a while to find her path. She quit high school after 11th grade, worked in a series of menial jobs, and entered what she calls "a dark period in my life." She was involved with drugs and alcohol, and had no direction for some time. Fortunately, a friend introduced her to an elder of the Odowa people, Wilfred Peltier, who took her under his wing. Along with his sister, Yvonne, they taught her to appreciate traditional teachings and gave her a new way to look at the world. She had always painted as a hobby, but now she wanted to get back to her roots. She was inspired by



floral beadwork, but soon realized she did not know enough about plants to paint them. She spent many years studying traditional plants.

Christis Belcourt's artwork has since received a great deal of recognition as an artist, with work in the permanent collects of the National Gallery of Canada, the Parliament building in Ottawa, and the Canadian Museum of Civilization, among others. She is equally well-known for her advocacy work. She is the lead coordinator for Walking With our Sisters, a community-driven project that honors murdered or missing Indigenous women. She is a lead organizer for the Onaman Collective, which encourages young Indigenous people to learn the language and traditional skills (such as canoe building and snow-shoe making) of their ancestors.

Belcourt is the recipient of numerous awards and honors, including the

Ontario Premier's Awards for Excellence in the Arts, Artist Award (2016), the Governor General's Innovation Award (2016), Art Gallery of Ontario People's Choice Award for *The Wisdom of the Universe* (2015), Aboriginal Arts Award Laureate, Ontario Arts Council (2014), Influential Women of Northern Ontario, Aboriginal Leadership Award (2014).

Amazingly, this very busy and accomplished woman graciously and quickly agreed to be a guest speaker for our humble organization when asked. She will be our first international artist, and I hope you will all be in attendance on February 14th for this special presentation.

Eligible Works: Members may submit one painting via the online entry process. We accept paintings done in water media including acrylic and gouache. Collage elements must be made of paper and any image or color on collage papers must be the work of the artist. All work must be original and on paper, Yupo or watercolor board.

Non-Eligible Works:

Copies, prints, classwork/ workshop creations, computer art, oils, water-soluble oils, varnished, textural materials, canvas and nude paintings are not acceptable. Artwork previously shown in any NJWCS exhibition or show will not be accepted.

Please prepare your digital image first before proceeding to the entry form. Digital images must show the image only, no mats or frame and display the correct horizontal or vertical orientation. Entries must be in .jpg format,1200 pixels on the longest side, and a resolution of 300 dpi. File size not to exceed 3 MB.
