## PROGRAM NEWS

Our **May guest artist**, **James Sisti**, is truly a man of many talents. In addition to his artistic skills as an illustrator and botanical artist, he is a patient and articulate drawing instructor and a very good writer. His first book, "*A Field Guide to Journaling*," will be available soon, and he is a blogger and essayist. You can read some of his musings on his website blog (<u>http://www.hikeanddraw.nyc</u>) and another website called "Read While Waiting." HIs essay on the intelligence of crows is particularly amusing and informative.

In addition to reading, writing and drawing, James has a dizzying list of titles and accomplishments that include web designer, water safety instructor, SCUBA diver, wilderness guide, technical climber, expedition artist, documentary film-maker, Eagle Scout, Boy Scout merit badge counselor, wilderness guide, wilderness first responder (meaning he has learned basic medical skills for guides and search-and-rescue team members, including CPR and AED) and enthusiastic hiker, explore and camper. Clearly, James has no shortage of energy!

James grew up hiking and camping with his family on Long Island and the Hudson Valley. He was an Illustration Major at Pratt Institute in Brooklyn, and since then he has managed to forge a career combining his love of art and the outdoors. He is a wilderness guide for Adventure Untamed, and gives lessons through his own company, Hike and Draw. He has taught over 1000 adult students both online and in the field, with the hope of encouraging a love of nature through drawing and journaling.

With all of this adventure to draw from, James will undoubtedly be an entertaining and informative speaker. I am personally hoping for stories about a secret time capsule project and his stint last summer as an expedition artist for a scientific study in the Swiss Alps. That should be exciting!

Mr. Sisti will also act as prize judge for our annual Member's Show, and conduct a journaling workshop at The New York-New Jersey Trail Conference the day following our final meeting of the season.

*Follow up to April Meeting -* Our April guest artist, Taryn Pizza, mentioned that her Mahwah High School students will be having an end-of-the-year exhibit, so I asked for the dates. I am particularly interested in attending because the High School has built a new "STEAM" building that contains a dedicated art gallery. This did not exist when my two kids went there, and I find it encouraging and astounding. I have attended many events in the school's theater-like auditorium, which gave the music and drama departments a fitting stage. Finally, visual arts are getting due recognition! If you would also be interested in attending, the school is located at 50 Ridge Road in Mahwah. Additional information is contained in Ms. Pizza's note:
