#### Our November guest artist is Woolpunk.

"Woolpunk..has the hands of a gifted artisan, the soul of a social activist, and the passion of an environmentalist." — Hildreth York, Curator, Writer, Emeritus

Woolpunk® is an American artist, born in Summit, NJ in 1971. Woolpunk® employs materials and techniques sourcing women's work creation, historically; she machine-knits fiber installations, quilts sculptures, and embroiders photographs. Her work consequently champions social change, addressing homelessness and foreclosures, water contamination, and deforestation. Referencing her unique stitching and use of fibers, she trademarked the name Woolpunk®, which she has been using creatively since 2004.
