## **PROGRAM**



Sarah Canfield, Embers, Pastel on paper

Sarah Canfield's body of work is full of contradictions and juxtapositions. She deliberately creates many contrasts in her pieces, such as merging photographs with painted imagery, painting modern objects using traditional fine art mediums, and presenting everyday items in a manner that magnifies their significance. Her paintings are at once photorealistic and abstract, painted and constructed. She is inspired by technology and how it has intruded into the natural world, yet she has found ways to make wires and keyboards look lovely.

Ms. Canfield calls herself a multi-media artist and works in an impressive array of materials, including collage, sculpture, photography, and pastel. She often uses these materials in innovative ways. For example, she physically alters photographic prints by adding or removing ink and paint, and/or manipulating images digitally. The results become source material for her paintings and collages.

She has recently added three dimensional constructions to her repertoire, and they are extraordinary.

They consist of layered images on transparent plexiglass that are backlit to create the illusion of depth, similar to a light box. Each piece is a hybrid of photography and painting techniques.

While researching for this article, I read that Sarah has been figure skating since childhood. The lightboxes are reminiscent of looking at something through layers of ice, so I sent her an email asking if ice skating has been an influence in her work. Here is her thoughtful reply:

"Figure skating has been an inspiration in my art across the board, interestingly it's taken me awhile to realize how much so! At one point I encased my still life objects in ice and used that as source imagery for various paintings and also for some of the imagery in my lightbox pieces. So, the theme of embedding, depth and transparency is there in the lightbox pieces. I also happened to start using ice imagery in my art around the time when I returned to skating as an adult here in New Jersey. It's been awhile since I've done the still life freezing, but that process seemed to be a catalyst for abstraction in my work. The lightboxes were a product of several years of experimentation that I'll talk about more during my presentation, so while skating played a role, it's part of a bigger picture also."

Sarah has a solo show upcoming at Caldwell University, beginning October 24<sup>th</sup>. It is open to the public, and she invites anyone who is interested to attend. She is excited to be exhibiting work in a wide variety of media, particularly a new media form she will be exhibiting for the first time ever.
